FUND RAISING DRIVE

During the past several years your Fire Company has been replacing worn out and obsolete equipment. Also, they have purchased new equipment such as flood lights and generator for use at night fires, auxiliary portable pump, and a Scott Air-Pac for use in smoke or gas filled buildings. This Air-Pac has proved very useful at several recent fires. In addition, the building housing the auditorium and engine house has been renovated as reported in the previous News Letter. Of course, all of this costs money and many people in the community have responded splendidly the past few years in helping their Fire Company obtain the equipment needed to do a thorough, efficient job.

Much of the expense connected with the above has already been paid for or, as in the case of the new Mack Fire Engine, the money is available. However, new committments have been made for two major expenditures. The money for these had to be borrowed. The new Engine House alone is costing between \$7,500 and \$8,000 to build and equip, plus \$2,000 for 1300 feet of hose and other items. Naturally, we hope that a substantial part of this sum may be realized from the Carnival. However, much of the proceeds from the Carnival must be allocated for year-round operating expense. To meet our obligations the Committee has set a goal of \$4,000. Consequently, it is necessary that everyone in the community co-operate to the fullest to make the Fund Raising Drive a success.

Like all other local fire companies, the Richboro Fire Company responds to fires in adjacent communities in the same way that eighteen companies munities in the same way that eighteen companies responded to the fire at the Richboro School on the night of March 29th. HOWEVER, IT IS IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER THAT WHILE THE FIRE COMPANY GOES BEYOND THE BOUNDS OF NORTHAMPTON TOWNSHIP TO FIGHT FIRES, IT DOES NOT SOLICIT FUNDS IN THIS DRIVE EXCEPT IN NORTHAMPTON TOWNSHIP. THEREFORE, IT IS THE DUTY OF EVERY RESIDENT OF THE TOWNSHIP IRRE-SPECTIVE OF WHERE THEY ARE LOCATED TO SUPPORT THEIR FIRE COMPANY IN THIS

DRIVE.

Last year we sent a report to members of the community to bring them information concerning their Fire Company. Some folks were kind enough to express their appreciation and interest in what we were trying to do. At that time we told you of some accomplishments, and of some plans for the future.

During the past year we have been carrying forward these plans for rehabilitation and expansion of equipment and facilities to meet the growing needs of our community. As explained in our previous report those plans centered about replacing old and obsolete equipment with modern fire-fighting facilities.

A Mack 75-Triple Combination Pumper with 600 gallon booster tank is almost ready for delivery as this is being written. The acquisition of this new engine revived an old problem, that of satisfactory housing for the engine. This subject will be dealt with further in another section of this report.

During the past year it was necessary to add to or replace certain facilities of the building and grounds. A new, improved outdoor lighting system mounted on steel poles was installed to replace the previous system which was badly damaged during a storm. The loss was covered by insurance, which partially paid for the new lighting. The well had to be re-drilled to increase the flow of water; new folding chairs were bought for the auditorium, dishes and equipment in the kitchen were replaced.

FIRE POLICE

ENGINE HOUSE

For many years the space used to house the present fire equipment has been inadequate. It is also difficult to back the engines up the incline into the building. It had been necessary to reinforce the floor to support the old Hahn Pumper. When your Fire Company decided the time had come to order a new fire engine they also realized that due to the greater size and weight of the new equipment, the present engine house would have to be replaced.

Accordingly, a new wing has been added to the present building to provide space for an Engine House. This new addition has been made large enough to allow plenty of room for the present equipment, plus the addition of counters along the walls. The floor of the new engine house is slightly above road level which simplifies backing the engines into the house, particularly in wet or icy weather. The concrete floor is adequate to carry the weight of the engines and also will permit washing the fire engines during cold weather. The new engine house will connect by stairs with both the main floor and the basement of the main building. At Carnival time the many windows can be opened outward and together with permanently installed counters and other equipment will make an efficient arrangement for serving refreshments.

The space which is presently being used for housing the engines will now be available for the use of the kitchen when indoor dinners are being served, or as a small meeting room for local community activities.

PARADE, DEDICATION AND HOUSING

On Monday, July 5th, more than a year's planning will reach a climax. The dedication of the newly added engine house, and the housing of the new Mack Type 75 Triple Combination Pumper will take place about 3:30 P. M. These ceremonies will be preceded by a parade of fire engines from neighboring communities.

The parade will start at 2 P. M. from Richboro proceding South on Second Street Pike to Springville, then East on Bristol Road to Churchville and North on Bustleton Pike to Richboro. Upon their return to Richboro the visiting fire engines will proceed to the school grounds where they will be on exhibition. Richboro's new fire engine will stop at the Fire House, at which time the engine house will be dedicated and the new engine housed with appropriate ceremonies.

After the engine has been housed the next center of interest will be the grounds of the Richboro School where field games and novelty races, etc., will be held. All are invited and urged to participate. Prizes will be given to winning contestants. At 6:30 P. M. there will be a soft ball game between picked local teams. Light refreshments will be available on the school grounds. Everyone is invited to bring a picnic lunch and spend the afternoon having fun. THIS IS A "ONCE IN A GENERATION" AFFAIR, SO DON'T MISS IT.
