

Letter from the Chairman

Dear Northampton Township Resident:

In the wake of recent hurricanes that impacted the United States and Puerto Rico, I would like to remind the citizenry of Northampton Township about the importance of emergency preparedness and the simple steps we can all take that would assist you and your family should an emergency event occur in our community. Your safety will depend on being alert, knowing proper steps to take, when to stay in your home, when to go to a shelter, what to do with your family pet, and how to get up-to-date information on the emergency.

There are many emergencies that can impact Northampton. The most common are winter storms, power outages, flooding, and hazardous materials incidents. Every emergency, including very serious ones such as terrorist acts involves the same basic planning for your protection.

Developing a simple emergency plan will provide you and your family with general information that will be very helpful when that emergency occurs. To assist you in developing an emergency plan, here are some general tips to consider:

Preparing Your Home for an Emergency: Preparing for an emergency requires considering all likely scenarios that could result when things that you rely on daily, like electricity, water, heat, air conditioning, telephone service, and transportation, are disrupted or lost for a considerable amount of time. Consequently, you should plan on having food, water, and other essentials to get you through the emergency. Most emergency management planners suggest having enough supplies to last you and your family for three-to-five days for weather-related events.

Your Emergency Preparedness Kit: The seven basic items that should be stored in your home are water, food, first-aid supplies, clothing, bedding, tools, emergency supplies, medications, and specialty Items. Keep a sufficient supply of daily medications. Keep the items that you would most likely need at home in one easy-to-carry container such as a trash can, camping backpack, or duffel bag. Store it in a convenient place and put a smaller version in your car. Consult your physician or pharmacist about storing prescription medications, and maintain a list of your prescription needs.

What to Do When Electrical Power is Lost: Disruption of electrical service can occur as a result of many things, including lightning, high winds, ice heavy snow, and equipment failure. For the most part, service is normally restored within a short period. However, major power outages can happen for extended periods from time to time. When power is lost, you should contact: PECO ENERGY 1-800-841-4141.

Keeping Warm: Particularly in winter months, long term power outages have a greater impact. Select a single room in the home in which the entire family can live; ideally a room which gets sunlight during daylight hours. Use fireplaces and wood-burning stoves with care and always supervise them when burning. Make sure the fireplace is in proper working condition and has been inspected before use. Wear layers of clothing, including hats, sweaters, and coats, which entraps warm air and helps to maintain body heat for longer periods. For homes with natural gas heaters, keep meters and vents clear of ice and snow. Do not attempt to keep warm in a vehicle.

Keeping Updated on an Emergency: Getting information during an emergency situation is vital, especially at the height of the event, when evacuation may be required. Keep a battery-operated radio handy. Radio and television stations provide the quickest means to obtain information. Township emergency information will be posted on the Township's website www.northamptontownship.com, broadcast over radio station – WKYW (1060 AM) as well as COMCAST Television Channel 22, Verizon Television Channel 24 and other local news outlets. Additional information can also be obtained by visiting the Federal Emergency Management Agency's website www.ready.gov. To receive alerts regarding local emergencies, all residents are encourage to sign up for notifications from Bucks County Emergency Management Services at www.buckscounty.org/ReadyBucks

YARD WASTE CHANGE

Starting the week of December 18th through March 31st yard waste is collected the SAME DAY as trash and limited to (5) five containers. Biodegradable bags are not required. Trash cans 32 gallons or smaller and plastic bags may be used only during this time. Leaf and yard waste collection will resume to unlimited collection the week of April 2, 2018 following trash/recycling collection day.

CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL

Collection of Christmas trees will occur the week of January 15, 2018. Christmas trees will be collected the day after your trash/recycle collection day. Please do not put your tree out before this week.

TOWNSHIP TIDBIT:

Mill Race Inn was built in 1787, the building originally served as a gristmill where grain brought in by local farmers was grounded into flour.

The John Thompson House is a historic house near Richboro. It was built back in 1740 and was owned by John Thompson. John Thompson was a local American Revolutionary War Veteran. On July 16, 1973, The John Thompson House was listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Northampton Township residents who have not paid their 2017 real estate taxes have until December 15th to pay their bill by check or money order. After December 15th, through the tax deadline of December31st, I can only accept certified check, bank check or money order. Even though the tax office will be closed from December 24th and will re-open January 2, 2018, you can still pay your tax bill by mail or use the drop box outside the Township Administration building as contents of the box will be checked every day.

Face value of the CR real estate and occupation due date is October 31st. And finally, if paying by installments, the 3RD installment real estate due date is November 30th.

"BATTLE OF THE HAMPTONS" FOOD DRIVE

During a three-week period in July, the employees and residents of Northampton Township participated in a food collection to benefit the Jesus Focus Ministry Food Pantry at Bethanna. Northampton has run various competitions over the past 8 years to benefit the pantry, but this year we challenged Lower Southampton and Upper Southampton Townships to collect non-perishable food items for the pantry of their choice. Northampton and Upper Southampton collected for the pantry at Bethanna and Lower Southampton collected for Assumption BVM's pantry. And thus was born the "Battle of the Hamptons".

The results were outstanding. On Tuesday, August 1st, a convoy from Northampton Township delivered 4,000 pounds of food to Bethanna! Marcy Barnes, the director of the pantry, and her dedicated squad of volunteers were overwhelmed by the generosity of our employees and residents. The key to our success was definitely teamwork. Parks and Recreation had collection bins for the camp kids and at the pool. Members of the Senior Center brought bags of food to their exercise class. Library patrons filled the bins several times. And the Police Department's "Fill the HumVee" campaign was so successful, they filled the HumVee twice, they filled the transport van, and they filled two pick-up trucks! Plus, the Police Benevolent Association donated \$300 of food and one generous lady donated \$300 in grocery gift cards.







The pantry at Bethanna also received 900+ pounds (1176 items) from Upper Southampton and Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church received 687 items from Lower Southampton Township. This was a great joint effort by all with the winning team being the patrons of the food pantries.

WALL OF HONOR CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

The Northampton Township Wall of Honor is an award to recognize individuals who have made lasting contributions to the community and have contributed to the quality of life for the residents of Northampton Township, Bucks County PA. The individual selected will be honored with placement of a plaque that will be mounted on the Wall of Honor located in the Township's Municipal Park for all to see and become a part of Northampton Township's history

The objective of the Wall of Honor Program is to see that individuals which have made valuable and lasting contributions to the community are recognized. The honoree will be selected by a committee based on the following specific criteria.

CRITERIA

- The nominee must have been a resident during the time of community service, contribution or accomplishment the nominee is being nominated for.
- The nominee's activities and/or accomplishments must benefit or have had a positive impact on the lives of the residents of Northampton Township;
- · The nominee's activities involved volunteer activities;
- The nominee demonstrated outstanding qualities of leadership and community spirit;
- The nominee would be considered a role model;
- If the nominee is being considered solely for community service one must exhibit involvement for five (5) or more years of significant community service.
- · The nominee may be living or deceased.
- The nominee, if a public servant, can not be in office or have been in office at least 3 years prior to the nomination. The nominee is not being nominated solely for public service.
- A nomination may be made by more than one individual, the more support the stronger the nomination.

NOMINATION PROCESS

- 1) To nominate an individual for this honor, a nomination form must be completed and submitted to the Wall of Honor Committee for review. The committee is made up of 7 individuals who represent the diversity of the community.
- 2) Nominations will be called each year and accepted up until November 30 each year.
- 3) All new nominations will be reviewed and voted on by the committee no later than March 31.
- 4) The person who submitted the nomination will be notified shortly after the vote is finalized. Notification to the recipient's family will be planned out-accordingly.
- 5) The number of recipients will be limited to a maximum of two per year; there may be years when no individuals are nominated and/or no nominees are selected to receive this award



- 7. Don't let the children eat the candy before it's inspected.





A plant hopper, the spotted lanternfly is known to utilize over 25 species in Pennsylvania and has the potential to greatly impact the grape, tree fruit, plant nursery and timber industries.

From the Building and Codes Department

In our last issue, we discussed the design guidelines that were approved for our Village Overlay Districts in Richboro and Holland. In conjunction with those guidelines, the Bucks County Planning Commission unveiled the Richboro Master Plan at the Township Planning Commission meeting on August 8th.

As consultant for the project, the Bucks County Planning Commission took a comprehensive look at Richboro and looked at the following topics: Vision, Present-Day Richboro: Conditions and Character, Transportation and Circulation, and the Economic and Business Environment. All of these items were combined into a document that proposes revitalization strategies, improves mobility, safety, and access, develops the economy, and makes Richboro a special place.

Currently, the document is still under review and will ultimately be incorporated into our Comprehensive Plan in the near future.
