## 300<sup>TH</sup> Anniversary Finale

The Parks and Recreation Department in conjunction with the Board of Supervisors, Township Manager, Assistant Manager, and Township Professional's joined together to celebrate the 300<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Northampton Township. The Board reenacted the signing of the Township

Resolution and everyone dressed up in colonial garb to celebrate this milestone in Township history.

## Proclamation for Nancy Opalka, Parks and Recreation Director

Chairman Selisker called on Dr. Kimberly Rose to present a proclamation to Nancy Opalka for her retirement. The Proclamation outlined the many achievements she has accomplished as Parks and Recreation Director over her 30 years of service.

## PUBLIC COMMENT

Joe Johnson, 41 Grant Drive asked if the Country Club was still operating in the red. Questioned the total amount of debt the Township owes. Mr. Pellegrino replied the Northampton Country Club is improving and should be in the black in 2023. The total debt for the Township is 64 million and the Township pays off approximately 2 million a year towards that debt.

A motion was made and seconded (Salzer-Gasper) to approve the consent items. All consent items were approved by Unanimous Consent.

#### NEW BUSINESS

## <u>Consider Resolution Authorizing a Grant Application to the PA Small Water and Sewer Program</u> <u>for a Grant to Retrofit the Northampton Crossing Detention Basin</u>

Mr. Salzer stated in early 2022, the Township was awarded a partial DEP Growing Greener Program grant to convert the existing stormwater management basin at the intersection of Holland Road and Upper Holland Road into an infiltration basin.

The purpose of the basin conversion is to improve water quality and reduce sediment release to address the requirements of our State stormwater system permit (MS4). This is achieved by stripping clay material from the basin bottom, installing new soil that allows water infiltration,

and planting water-tolerant perennials. The estimated project cost is \$615,000 and the previous DEP grant award was \$300,000.

Because of this shortfall in funding, the Administration is recommending that the Township seek an additional grant through the PA Small Water and Sewer Grant Application. The grant request is for the additional project cost not funded by the DEP grant. There is no matching requirement from the Township for this project.

The grant program requires a Resolution from the governing body authorizing an individual to submit the grant application on behalf of the Township. A draft Resolution was provided for your review.

A motion was made and seconded (Salzer-Rose) to adopt Resolution R-22-22 authorizing the Township Manager to file a grant application with the PA Small Water and Sewer Program Grant to improve the detention basin at Holland and Upper Holland Roads, and to authorize the Township Manager and or Assistant Township Manager to execute all documents required by the grant program.

Chairman Selisker called for Board and public comment. None was heard.

# Consider Final Approval of the 2023 Proposed Budget

Chairman Selisker asked Mr. Pellegrino to briefly summarize the proposed 2023 budget.

Mr. Pellegrino briefly reviewed the proposed 2023 budget and explained the variables that affect revenues and expenditures. He noted changes from 2022 to 2023 and stated there is no proposed tax increase in the proposed 2023 budget an increase in the debt service tax is necessary for the new fire stations.

Mr. Pellegrino also noted the contracts for waste collection and disposal will increase in 2023. Waste collection and transportation will increase from \$2.64 million to \$5.18 million with the new Whitetail Disposal contract for waste collection. The three disposal contracts will collectively increase by \$190,000. The current rate for trash, recycling, and yard waste collection and disposal are \$299 per year per household. Based on the new collection contract with Whitetail Disposal, and the projected increase for the three disposal contracts, the fee must be increased to \$575.

Mr. Pellegrio stated the millage will stay the same as follows with no proposed tax increase:

Dr. Rose stated the e proposed 2023 Budget was advertised for public inspection on November 18, 2022, and a copy was available in the Township Administration Building and on the Township website since the Preliminary Budget adoption by the Board on November 16, 2022.

To date, the Administration received no calls about the proposed budget and no one visited the Administration building to review the document. The Preliminary Budget is ready for final adoption unless the Board has any changes.

A motion was made and seconded (Rose-Gasper) to approve the final adoption of the 2023 Preliminary Budget.

Chairman Selisker called for Board comment.

The Board thanked the Administration and the Finance Department for their hard work to provide a budget with no tax increase.

Mr. Selisker called for public comment. None was heard.
