LITHIUM-ION BATTERIES IN YOUR HOME - SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

Most of the electronics in our homes — smartphones, tablets, power and lawn tools, e-bikes and scooters, laptops, e-cigarettes, headphones, and toys, to name just a few — are powered by lithium-ion batteries. When lithium-ion batteries fail, they can overheat, catch fire, or explode. This can be caused by damage, overcharging, or using the wrong charging equipment.

Safety tips:

- When buying a product that uses a lithium-ion battery, take time to research it.
 Look for a stamp from a nationally recognized testing lab on the packaging and product, which means that it meets established safety standards.
- Many products sold online and in stores may not meet safety standards and could increase the risk of fire.



- Charge with the manufacturer's equipment only. Using a third-party or aftermarket charger can damage the battery and increase the risk of fire.
- Do not overcharge. Do not leave your device charging unattended or overnight. Unplug the device and charger once the battery is full.
- Charge on a flat, dry surface. Keep charging devices away from flammable materials like a couch, bed, or carpet. Charge in a dry area, away
 from direct sunlight or liquids.
- Store batteries properly. Keep batteries away from extreme temperatures. Store them in a cool, dry place, ideally between 68°F and 77°F (20°C and 25°C).
- · Handle batteries carefully. Avoid dropping, crushing, or puncturing the battery. Physical damage can cause an internal short and a fire.
- Check for damage. Only use batteries that are free from visible damage. If you see dents or other damage to the battery casing, stop using it.

Warning signs of a failing battery:

Stop using the battery immediately if you notice any of these signs:

- Excessive heat: The device or battery feels extremely hot to the touch.
- Swelling or bulging: The device's shape changes, or the battery pack appears swollen.
- · Leaking: There is a leak of liquid from the battery.
- Hissing, cracking, or popping sounds: You hear unusual noises coming from the battery.
- Unusual odor: The battery emits a strong or unusual smell.

What to do in an emergency:

If a battery starts to fail or catch fire:

- Evacuate immediately. The fumes can be toxic.
- Call 911. Do not try to extinguish a large fire yourself. Alert the fire department so they can respond appropriately.
- If it is safe to do so, move the device away. Use tongs or gloves to move the device away from flammable materials and out of the home.

Yard Waste Pickup Ends Dec. 15

After Dec. 15, all yard waste must go in your regular trash cart.

No separate cans or bags will be collected until composting resumes on April 1.



Trash & Recycling Information

All You Need to Know About Trash Services in Northampton Township

To ensure smooth collection, please place your trash and recycling Toters curbside the night before your scheduled pickup day.

Important Reminder

Only trash placed inside your official Northampton Township Toter will be collected. Bags, boxes, or other items left outside the Toter will not be picked up. If you regularly have more trash than one Toter can hold, you may request a second Toter through Casella by calling 610-936-9967. There is a charge for an additional Toter.

Residents may request an additional recycling can at no charge by calling the Township at 215-357-6800 x201 and asking for Lisa. New construction residents should also call Lisa to order a Trash Toter and a Recycle Bin.

Toter Guidelines

- Only Northampton Township-issued Toters may be used.
- Place Toters at least 3 feet away from mailboxes, cars, street signs, or other Toters.
- Position the Toters with the wheels facing your house so they can be emptied properly.
- All trash must be bagged with lids closed to prevent spills.
- Trash or recycling in Toters cannot exceed 100 lbs, as this may damage the automated arm. Manual pick-up: collectors are not required to lift more than 45 lbs.

Trash Can Placement & Pickup Reminder

To ensure smooth and timely collection, please follow these guidelines for placing your trash and recycling toters curbside:

- When to Place Toters: Put your trash and recycling toters at the curb after 6:00 PM the night before your scheduled collection day.
- How Long Toters Can Remain: Toters should be returned from the curb promptly after collection.

Seasonal Early Start Times

During road work season and the winter months, trash collection companies may begin as early as 4:00 AM to stay ahead of construction delays or snow and ice storms.

Early morning collections are permitted to ensure public health and safety.

- Placing your toter out the night before ensures you won't miss collection if trucks start earlier than usual.
- Please note: If your trash is not out when trucks arrive, the Township will not consider it a "missed pickup."

What We Cannot Take

- Hazardous Waste (radioactive, reactive, toxic, ignitable, corrosive, or acidic items)
- E-Waste (televisions, computers, electronics)
- Construction & Demolition Debris (concrete, roofing, remodeling waste cannot be placed in Toters or recycling)

Recycling Boxes

- Boxes may be placed outside of the recycling Toter, but they must be broken down and tied or taped together for easy pickup.
- Large items such as refrigerators or mattresses require a scheduled bulk pickup with Casella. Please see the Casella website for bulk pickup regulations: www.whitetaildisposal.com/ municipality/northamptontownship/

Bulk Waste Collection

- Bulk waste includes large household items like furniture, carpets, mattresses, and appliances.
- Each residential property may place one bulk item at the curb per week. Sets of multiple pieces (like a patio set) may require multiple pickups.
- Bulky items may need to be broken up and securely tied in bundles, not exceeding 50 lbs or 3 feet in length, for safe collection.
- Toilets and Mattresses must be bagged for sanitary reasons.
- Any item containing glass cannot be collected as bulk. All glass must be removed and disposed of separately before pickup.
- Bulk collection does not include construction materials, hazardous items, or anything that poses a safety risk.
- Some large or specialty items require special trucks on a separate schedule and may not be included in regular service.

Yard Waste & Christmas Trees

From **December 16 through March 31,** yard waste should be placed inside your Township-issued Toters.

Christmas Tree Collection:

- Trees will be collected January 15th, 16th, and 17th on your regular yard waste schedule.
- Place your tree curbside along with your regular trash and recycling; trees will be collected the day after your regular service.
- . Trees over 6 feet tall should be cut in half.
- · All decorations must be removed.
- · Do not bag trees for pickup.
- By keeping all trash inside the Toter, following weight limits, and adhering to recycling and bulk pickup rules, you help ensure safe, efficient, and reliable collection for the entire community.



MATTRESSES & TOILETS

Preparation Guidelines

- To protect sanitation workers: Mattresses and box springs must be completely wrapped in plastic.
- · Toilets must be securely bagged.

BULK ITEM COLLECTION

Scheduling Instructions

To schedule a bulk item pickup, you must contact Whitetail Disposal by 12:00 PM the day before your regular service day:

YARD WASTE COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Regular Season: April 1 - December 15 • Off-Season: December 16 - March 31

Yard waste is collected the **day after your trash/recycling pickup** and taken to a composting facility. **Preparation Requirements:**

- Use biodegradable 30-gallon paper bags or labeled containers weighing under 50 lbs.
- · Plastic bags are not accepted.
- Tree branches/shrubbery must be:
 - Under 36 inches long
 - Less than 3 inches in diameter
 - Bundled and tied, taped, or placed in biodegradable bags
 - Not extending over the top of the container or bag

Place yard waste directly into your Northampton Township trash toters for pickup.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: RADIOACTIVE MATERIALS IN TRASH DISPOSAL

Over the past three months, Casella Waste Systems has lost the use of four trucks—each sidelined for more than a week—due to the improper disposal of radioactive material in the residential waste stream. Unfortunately, we experienced yet another incident today.


In the trash industry, this type of occurrence is sometimes referred to as a "Hot Load." It happens when radioactive material is mistakenly placed in household trash. When this occurs, trucks must be taken out of service for extended periods to ensure safety, resulting in delays, costly repairs, and unnecessary risks.

We want to remind all residents that radioactive materials are strictly prohibited from disposal with regular household trash. These items cannot be managed through standard waste collection due to the serious safety hazards they create.

In some cases, these materials may come from individuals undergoing chemotherapy treatments, where certain medical by-products can register as radioactive. While these situations are usually low-level, they still cause trucks to be flagged, pulled from service, and quarantined. Even small amounts create significant disruption.

We ask for your help in keeping our workers, equipment, and community safe. If you or someone in your household may have materials of concern, please contact your healthcare provider or local waste authority for proper disposal options.

Thank you for doing your part to ensure the safety of our drivers, our community, and our environment.



Trash & Recycling Information

TOWNSHIP TRASH & RECYCLING TOTERS - REQUIRED USE

Northampton Township reminds all residents that only Township-provided trash and recycling toters are permitted for use. These Toters are designed for automated collection and ensure safety, efficiency, and consistency in service.

Important Notes:

- Trash and recycling must be placed in Township-issued Toters.
- Personal containers are not permitted for trash or recycling.
- A limited exception applies only to properties located in designated **manual collection areas** where automated trucks cannot be used. These areas are specifically identified by the Township.
- Yard waste must be placed in personal containers or paper bags for collection. Township Toters are not used for yard waste pickup.
- Recyclables should never be placed in plastic bags. Plastic bags are not recyclable and will cause your recycling to be rejected.

If you are unsure whether your property is in a manual collection area, please **contact the Township Office** or visit our website at **www.northamptontownship.com** for more information.

By using Township-issued Toters for trash and recycling, keeping recyclables loose (not bagged), and following yard waste guidelines, residents help maintain reliable collection, reduce equipment damage, and keep our neighborhoods safe and clean.

Stormwater Management

If you've been thinking about reducing your environmental footprint, you can take steps to decrease the amount of pollution that flows into local waterways every time it rains. Known as stormwater, once rain or snow hits the ground, it can pick up dirt, chemicals, and other pollutants and carry them downstream from your sidewalks, streets, and alleys to bodies of water in your community.

Rain is great for growing things in the city, but excess rain can run off from roofs, pavement, and other hard surfaces into the street, where it flows from the storm drain into local rivers, lakes, or streams, taking pollution from those surfaces with it. Here are just a few steps you can take to be stormwater smart, starting in your own neighborhood



- If you park your car on the street, check for spots underneath it, which could be a sign of leaky oil or other fluids that can contaminate stormwater as it washes by. Don't let your leak pollute.
- Street sweeping is an important part of stormwater management; during posted sweeping hours, don't park your car on the street.
- Keep garbage cans covered to keep trash from blowing and avoid rainwater getting contaminated by your trash. Never dump garbage in alleys or gutters.
- Read the label to dispose of household chemicals and paints properly, and never dump them in the alley, on the sidewalk, or in the street.

DID YOU KNOW?

Everything you put on the ground can possibly contaminate local water bodies and affect public health.



- Keep raked leaves or yard clippings out of the storm drain to avoid clogs and debris that can reach waterways.
- Don't hose down sidewalks; that will flush dirt down through the storm drain system!
- During colder weather, avoid oversalting the sidewalk or use "green" deicer—a little goes a long way!
- Always pick up after your dog by putting waste in a bag and disposing it in an appropriate waste container, rather than dropping it in the storm



- Never drop cigarette butts on the ground; put out cigarettes and drop the butts in a proper receptacle or trash can.
- Always put trash in its place and keep it away from storm drains.

A Message from Public Works

WINTER SNOW REMOVAL REMINDERS:

Our goal at the Public Works Department during the winter season is to make all Township-owned roads safe and accessible to the public. The cooperation and assistance of our residents is key to an effective winter storm operation. Due to many variables that are inherent in Pennsylvania weather, each storm and/or weather event may require slightly different efforts and/or emphasis on any number of maintenance tasks, which together, determine the overall winter maintenance, snow removal, or ice control strategy.





- Mailboxes are rarely hit by plows, but may be damaged by the weight of the plowed snow. We ask that homeowners ensure that their mailboxes are firmly attached to the post and that the post is sturdy enough to withstand the weight of the plowed snow. Residents should also be sure that the mailbox area is clear for mail delivery.
- If you believe that your street was missed during a snow clearing effort, call (215) 355-3433.

How do I report pot holes for patching?

For Township Roads, please call (215) 355-3433 to report pot hole location.

For any problem on the State Highways, please call PennDOT at 215-345-6060, or Submit a Concern on their website: www.penndot.gov

Who do I contact to remove dead deer?

We are no longer allowed to pick up dead deer. Please call the Police Non-Emergency # (215) 357-8700 and they will refer the request to the PA Game Commission or PennDOT.

Will you remove a tree that fell and is blocking the road?

If the tree belongs to the homeowner, we will clear the roadway and place the tree limbs, debris, etc. on the homeowner's property. The homeowner is responsible for contacting a landscaper to remove the tree debris from their property.

What is the mowing schedule for the Township basins?

We try to mow the 85 basins, 16 traffic islands, and the clear sight triangles on a 2 to 3-week turnaround schedule, however sometimes it is delayed due to the weather.

How do I report a Street Light that is not working, or a Street Sign that is damaged?

Call (215) 355-3433 with the exact location of the Street Light and the Pole # if applicable (this can be found on the Pole tag).

For damaged Traffic signs call (215) 355-3433 with the exact location of the sign.

Should you receive an alert (text message or email), follow the instructions and contact our office immediately. If fraudulent activity occurs, our office will connect you with the District Attorney's office. We cannot emphasize enough the importance that you follow-up on any alert, never assume it was received in error. Our staff is available to help and dedicated to keeping your investment safe.



Frequently Asked questions

What are your hours of operation?

Monday through Thursday from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. We are closed on all legal county holidays.

What taxes do I pay at your office?

Council Rock School District - Real Estate, Northampton Township Occupational (OCC), Northampton Township - Real Estate and Refuse Fee and Bucks County- Real Estate Taxes.

Who collects the Earned Income Tax?

Keystone Collection Group (866-539-1100) is contracted to collect the 1% Earned Income Tax (EIT). Most people have their EIT withheld from their paycheck. Make sure your employer has the correct political sub-division (PSD) code and that the code on your W-2 matches the council Rock PSD code (090603).

How do I change the name on my deed?

It is recommended that you consult with an attorney about changes you need to make to an existing deed.). Contact the Bucks County Recorder of Deeds (BCRD) by phone (215-348-6209) or visit the BCRD website at www.buckscounty.gov/414/Recorder-of-Deeds.

What is the mailing address and can we pay in person?

You can mall your check to the Northampton Township Tax Collector, located at 815 Bustleton Pike, Richboro, PA 18954. You can also pay in person during regular business hours with a check or money order. After-hours payments can be made via the designated, tamper proof, drop box located on the side of the Tax Office building.

How do I pay delinquent taxes?

Delinquent County and Township Taxes are collected by Bucks County Tax Claim (215-348-6274); School Occupational Taxes are collected by G.H. Harris Associates Inc (570-639-5005); and Council Rock School District Real Estate Taxes are collected by Portnoff Law Associates, Ltd (1-866-211-9466).

How do I change the mailing address for my real estate bill?

The Bucks County Board of Assessments (215-348-6219) can assist you. Simply send a letter making this request: Bucks County Board of Assessments, 55 E. Court Street, Doylestown, PA 18901. For any additional questions, please contact me at 215-357-1343 or visit VincentDeon@twptax.com.

Building and Codes Department - Frequently Asked Questions

1. Is a "Use and Occupancy Certificate" required for a residential resale?

No. The Township does not conduct an inspection or require a certificate for the resale of residential property.

2. Is a business license required from the Zoning Department?

No. The Zoning Department has no involvement with business licensing. Please contact your tax professional or attorney for applicable requirements based on your particular circumstances.

3. What are the requirements to construct a shed on my property?

Generally, a shed that is 240 square feet and less can be constructed behind the rear of the house at a setback of 7 feet from the property line. The maximum height is 12 feet. Sheds that exceed these requirements must follow different regulations based on your particular zoning district and lot size. Please call us for details.

4. What are the requirements to construct a fence on my property?

Generally, a fence can be constructed in the side and rear of the property, not in the front yard. The maximum fence height is six (6) feet. Corner lots and pool fences have special requirements as well. Please call us for details.

5. Can I run a business from my home?

Maybe. Home-based businesses have numerous requirements. As a result, given the unique nature of each business, please contact our department to discuss your particular circumstances.

Don't Wait — Check the Date!



Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years

Age matters when it comes to your smoke alarms.
Check the manufacture dates on your smoke alarms today!

Remove the smoke alarm from the wall or ceiling.





Look at the back of the alarm for the date of manufacture.

Smoke alarms should be replaced 10 years from the date of manufacture.





Put the alarm back on the ceiling or wall if it is less than 10 years old.



A closed door may slow the spread of smoke, heat and fire.



Test smoke alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.



If the smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside. Go to your outside meeting place.



Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home, including the basement. Larger homes may need more alarms. For the best protection, make sure all smoke alarms are interconnected. When one sounds, they all sound.



Call the fire department from a cellphone or a neighbor's phone. Stay outside until the fire department says it's safe to go back inside.

Winter driving can be hazardous and scary, especially in northern regions that get a lot of snow and ice. Additional preparations can help make a trip safer, or help motorists deal with an emergency. This sheet provides safety information to your residents to help prevent motor vehicle injuries due to winter storms.

THE THREE P'S OF SAFE WINTER DRIVING:

PREPARE for the trip; **PROTECT** yourself;
and **PREVENT** crashes on the road.

PREPARE

- **Maintain Your Car:** Check battery, tire tread, and windshield wipers, keep your windows clear, put no-freeze fluid in the washer reservoir, and check your antifreeze.
- **Have On Hand:** flashlight, jumper cables, abrasive material (sand, kitty litter, even floor mats), shovel, snow brush and ice scraper, warning devices (like flares) and blankets. For long trips, add food and water, medication and cell phone.
- **Stopped or Stalled?** Stay in your car, don't overexert, put bright markers on antenna or windows and shine dome light, and, if you run your car, clear exhaust pipe and run it just enough to stay warm.
- **Plan Your Route:** Allow plenty of time (check the weather and leave early if necessary), be familiar with the maps/ directions, and let others know your route and arrival time.

Practice Cold Weather Driving!

- During the daylight, rehearse maneuvers slowly on ice or snow in an empty lot.
- Steer into a skid.
- Know what your brakes will do: stomp on antilock brakes, pump on non-antilock brakes.
- Stopping distances are longer on water-covered snow and ice.
- Don't idle for a long time with the windows up or in an enclosed space.

PROTECT YOURSELF

- Buckle up and use child safety seats properly.
- Never place a rear-facing infant seat in front of an air bag.
- Children 12 and under are much safer in the back seat.

PREVENT CRASHES

- Drugs and alcohol never mix with driving.
- Slow down and increase distances between cars.
- Keep your eyes open for pedestrians walking in the road.
- Avoid fatigue Get plenty of rest before the trip, stop at least every three hours, and rotate drivers if possible.
- If you are planning to drink, designate a sober driver.


